

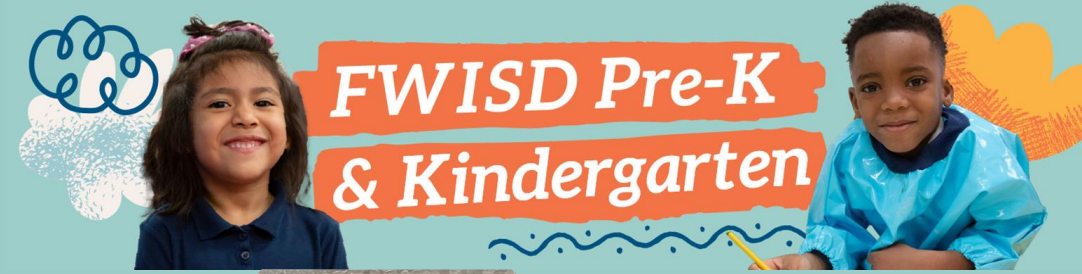

## Mission



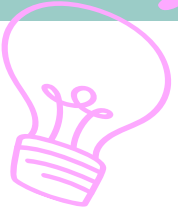

- Shares ownership and responsibility for all students' growth, success, and well-being by providing a positive and collaborative learning environment

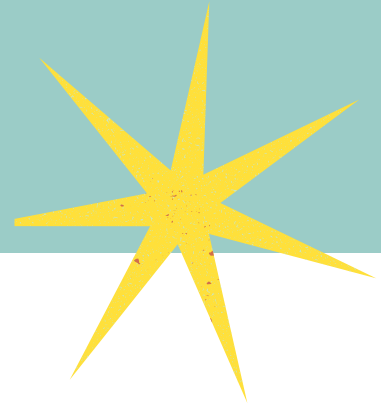

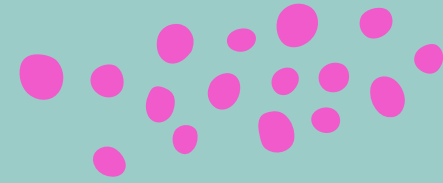

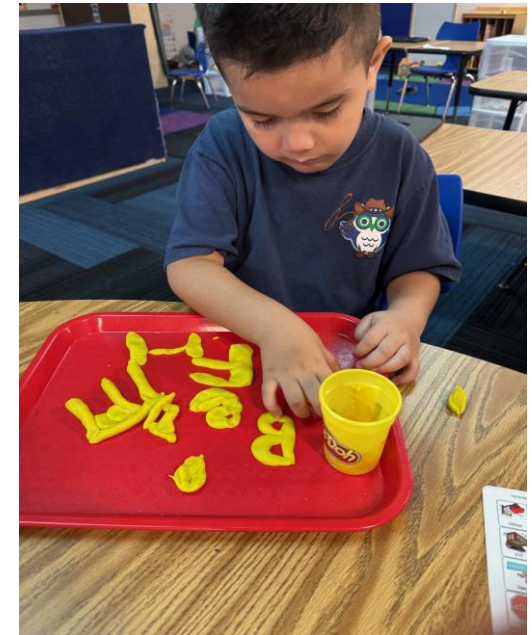




# ECSE

# FAQ

- Will my child take a nap?

Yes, rest time is 30 minutes for Pre-K 4 and 45 minutes for Pre-K 3

- Does my child need to be potty-trained?

No, this is not required for Pre-K. Please note that teachers/nurses are not allowed to change students.

- Will my child eat in the cafeteria, and what if they do not like the lunch?

Students will either eat in the classroom or the cafeteria; students are allowed to bring their own lunch from home

- Does my child need to wear a uniform?

Yes, the students will wear uniforms. Colors will depend on the campus

# How do I qualify for PK-4?

**Child must be 4 by September 1, 2026, for PK4**

**And one of the following:**

- **Income**
- **Language**
- **Homelessness**
- **Military**
- **Foster care**
- **Texas Star**
- **Child of a person employed as a full-time classroom teacher in an FWISD school that offers Pre-K**





# Pre- Kindergarten 4 Qualifiers

In Fort Worth ISD, there is a place for every Pre-K student

If your child meets federal qualifying guidelines, they are prioritized to receive a spot at their zoned campus.

In addition to the requirement for residency, the student must meet one of the following criteria to be considered for admission:

- Unable to speak and comprehend English language
- Economically or educationally disadvantaged (Income)
- Homeless
- The dependent of an active duty member of the armed forces of the United States
- The child of a person eligible for the Star of Texas Award
- Child has ever been in the conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services.
- Child of a person employed as a full time classroom teacher in FWISD school that offers Pre-K

# Pre- Kindergarten 4 Qualifiers

If your child does **not** meet federal qualifying guidelines, he or she is designated as a Universal Pre-K (UPK) student.

# What documents are needed for enrollment?

- Valid Email Address
- Parent Portal Account Login and Password
- Parent form of Identification
- Student Official Birth Certificate
- Current Immunization Record
- Proof of Residence
- Proof of Eligibility

# Proof of Residence

- Lease
- Utility bill (gas or water) in parent/guardian name
- Phone bill
- Cable bill not acceptable

If living with someone else, you must provide a notarized statement with a current utility bill in that person's name (must use notary)

# Qualification Documents:

## **TANF or SNAP**

- Most Recent Award Letter with case number and child's name

## **Medicaid**

- Approval letter or letter with dates of eligibility with child's name
- Medicaid insurance card not accepted

## **Military and Peace Officer**

- US department of Defence DoD photo identification for children of active duty service members.
- Purple heart orders or citation
- Line of duty determination documentation
- Letter from US department of Veterans affairs
- Documentation that a service member is MIA

## **Foster**

- DFPS foster/kinship placement documentation
- Court documents stating "state foster care" involvement
- Adoption paperwork completed by the originating state
- DFPS verification letter: This is the primary document issued by the DFPS to verify eligibility.

## **Mckinney Vento**

- Student Residency Questionnaire: A completed and verified form is the primary document.
- Verification by school district: District personnel must determine that the student fits the criteria for homelessness as defined by federal law, 42 U.S.C. Section 11302 and 42 U.S.C. Section 11434a.

The Department of Family and Protective Services**



# Eligibility- Language

**Language testing for students that speak languages other than English**

# How to get your child ready for Pre-K?

- Read 10-20 minutes nightly
- Talk with your child in complete sentences
- Play games with your child; practice taking turns
- Go to bed early
- Set routines for morning and evening
- Wake up early

Step 2: Enrollment in Parent Portal (April 1st)

Step 3: Back to School Forms (August 1st)
